Congratulations to our brother John Earl on his recent release of his original music and his new book "adventures of Randy" DVD & CD. We know John was encouraged and helped by his home church; Pentecostal Church in Jesus Christ and Pastor Bertha M Brown and thank them for helping John produce these.

Nationally, we have lost hundreds of corrections/detention/custody officers or deputies and other staff members to COVID-19. Even with the vaccine currently being distributed, we are not out of harm's way in our country's jails and prisons. Priority vaccine distribution is planned for public safety personnel and first responders, which rightfully includes correctional staff and correctional healthcare providers. However, vaccine production and distribution is a logistical challenge that will take time to accomplish.



News updates: TDCJ in total there have been 265,838 offenders and 104,377 employees tested for COVID-19. Of those tested, 27,273 offenders and 7,730 staff have tested positive for COVID-19 in both symptomatic and asymptomatic testing. There have been 24,081 offenders and 6,600 employees who have recovered. There have been 177 offender deaths connected to COVID 19 with an additional 43 under investigation. There have been 27 employee line of duty deaths from COVID-19. Please let us continue to pray for both the inmates and the courageous employees who continue serving them and our communities. Let's also not grow weary in supporting and praying for our first responders and health care employees as well.
